Born in Mexico on September 2, 1962.

Obtained an MA in Political Science from *Yale University* and a BA in Social Science from the *Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM)*.

Has had a distinguished career in the academic and public sectors.

Served as Electoral Advisor to the General Council of the Federal Electoral Institute, the IFE, which organized the federal elections of 1997, 2002 and 2003.

Has been a United Nations advisor and formed part of a UN delegation to design the electoral system for the Iraqi Constituent Assembly.

Mr. Lujambio has been a university professor for over 20 years at institutions such as the *Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México*, where he directed the BA in Political Science, as well as at the Universidad Iberoamericana and the National University of Mexico (UNAM).

He has published books, essays and articles on: democratic transition, electoral systems, federalism and the division of power and is a member of the Editorial Committee of the *Fondo de Cultural Económica*.

He was appointed Public Education Secretary on April 2009 by President Felipe Calderón
