# Thematic Priorities

1. Legal and regulatory progress and impact
  - made by implementation of the Directive
  - extension of scope?
2. Public sector organisation and culture change
  - including compliance with the Directive
3. Encouraging PSI re-use business
4. The financial impact of the Directive: pricing and charging
  - including impact on public sector costs and budget
5. Information management, standards and data quality

# Main purposes

- Raise awareness in public and private sectors
  - local government
- Build Europe-wide stakeholder community around PSI re-use
- Gain evidence on the ground of progress, problem analysis, need for further action

---

# Main activities

- Up to 35 national/regional level meetings (at least one per EU country)
- 15 Meetings on thematic issues in the 5 areas
- Final conference
- Supported by preparatory analysis, desk research, follow-up: a rolling programme
- Dissemination website, communication system, stakeholder database, benchmarking 'scorecard'
- Directory of cross-border products

# Intended results (1)

- Larger community of public and private sector stakeholders
  - engaged in consensus-building up to 2008 review of the Directive.
- Summative reports/recommendations on the five thematic areas
  - identification of remaining barriers and disputes.
- Greater visibility of pan-European and cross-border products/ services
  - successful business models.
  - Product/service directory
- Consensus-based definitions of good practice in key areas

---

## Intended results (2)

- Analysis of Directive transposition impact in each country
- Evidence of Directive impact on pricing and charging
  - in each state and in different PSI domains.
- Formation of an Industry Action Group (or similar) at European level
  - advocate and promote policies and activities leading to a more consistent and concerted approach to development of products and services based on PSI re-use
- Definition of key standards/ architectures needed
  - improved public-private sector interoperability for PSI re-use
