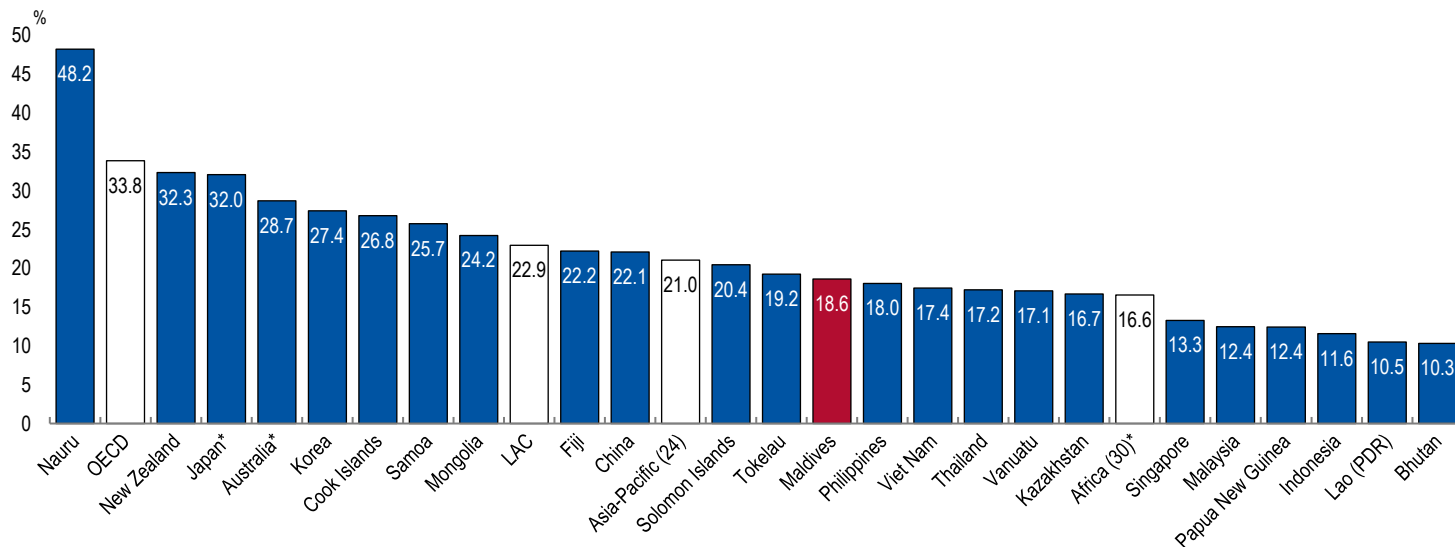


Revenue Statistics in Asia and the Pacific 2021 – Maldives

Tax-to-GDP ratio

Tax-to-GDP ratio compared to other Asian and Pacific economies and regional averages, 2019

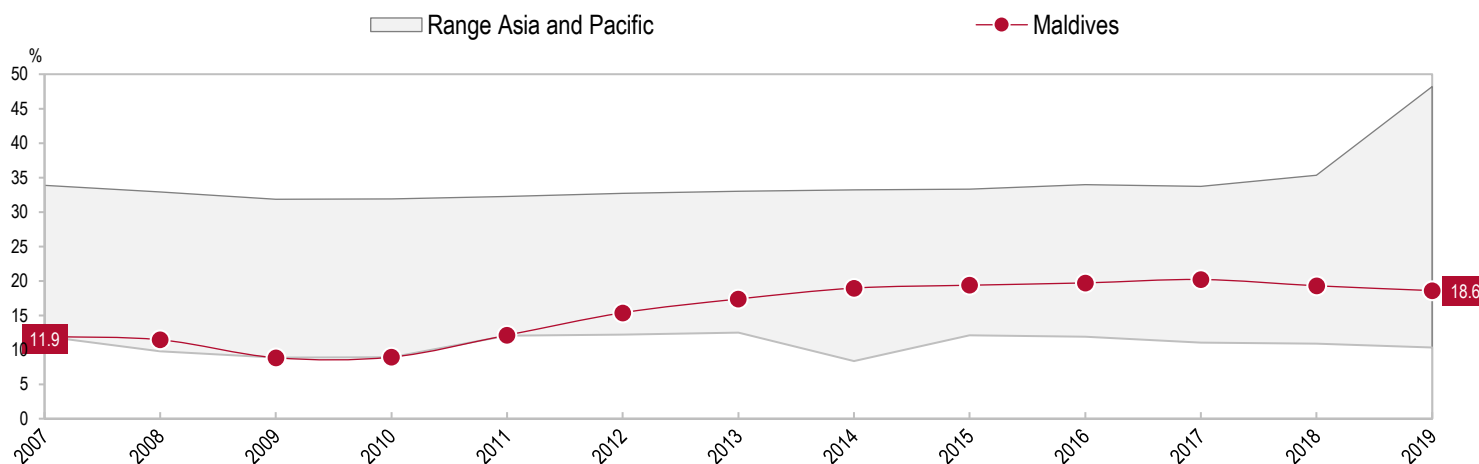
The Maldives tax-to-GDP ratio was 18.6% in 2019, below the Asia and Pacific (24) average of 21.0% by 2.5 percentage points. It was also below the OECD average (33.8%) by 15.3 percentage points.



* Data for 2018 are used for the Africa (30) average, Australia and Japan as 2019 data are not available.

Tax-to-GDP ratio over time

The tax-to-GDP ratio in the Maldives decreased by 0.7 percentage points from 19.3% in 2018 to 18.6% in 2019. From 2007 to 2019, the tax-to-GDP ratio in the Maldives increased by 6.7 percentage points from 11.9% to 18.6%. The highest tax-to-GDP ratio in this period was 20.2% in 2017, and the lowest 8.9% in 2009 and 2010.



In the OECD classification the term "taxes" is confined to compulsory unrequited payments to general government. Taxes are unrequited in the sense that benefits provided by government to taxpayers are not normally in proportion to their payments. <http://www.oecd.org/tax/tax-policy/oecd-classification-taxes-interpretative-guide.pdf>

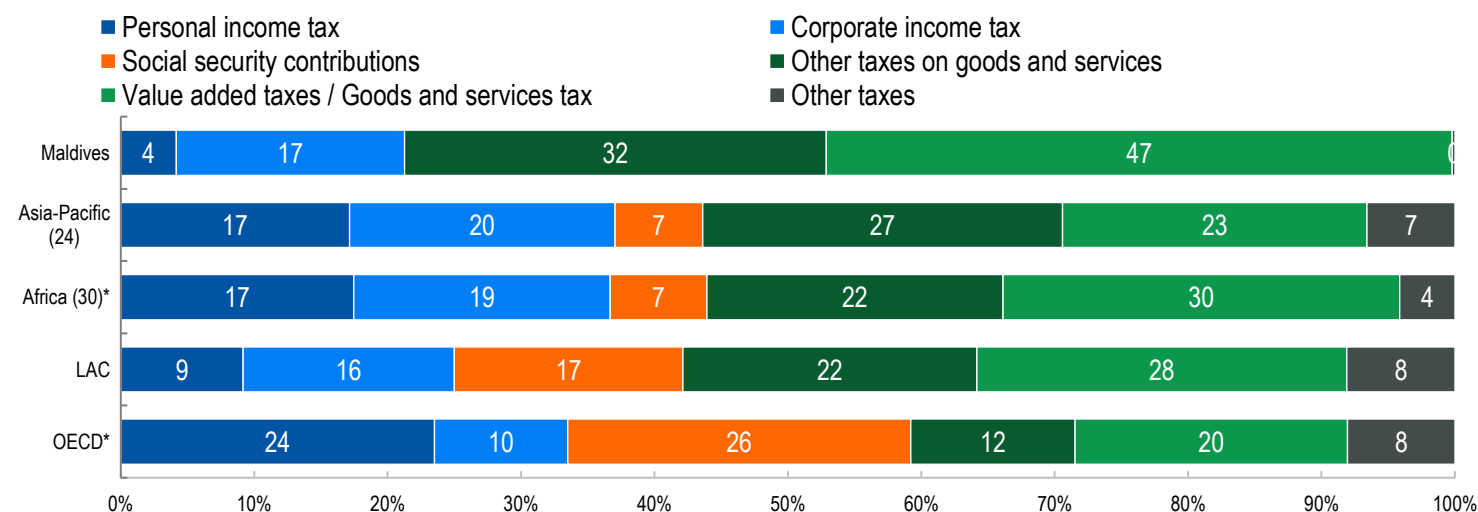

Tax structures

Tax structure compared to the regional averages

Tax structure refers to the share of each tax in total tax revenues. The highest share of tax revenues in the Maldives in 2019 was derived from value added taxes / goods and services tax (46.9%). The second-highest share of tax revenues in 2019 was derived from other taxes on goods and services (31.6%).

In this country note, "other taxes" is calculated as total tax minus taxes on income, profits and capital gains, social security contributions and taxes on goods and services. It includes taxes on payroll and workforce, taxes on property and other taxes (as defined in the OECD Interpretative Guide).
